



This illustrative painting lends itself to the medium very well. Nice selection of subject matter.


BEST IN WATERCOLOR Denise Cahill "Pink Hollyhock"

BEST IN OILS Robert D'Imperio "A View Under Ominous Skies"



The detail and handling of the trees in the foreground led me into the small town. I didn't see the ominous clouds at first because I was so focused on the bright beautiful sky above them. Well executed painting.

BEST IN MIXED MEDIA: Vincent Nardone

"Bay Seclusion" (Encaustic on Metal)



As an artist who works in encaustic I understand the idiosyncrasies of the medium. The painting technique is about layers and this piece managed to respect the medium and the ability to keep their control.

BEST IN SEASCAPE Linda Hejduk "Calm and Balanced" (acrylics)

The light airy movement in this painting with bold brushstrokes of crashing waves captures the shore essence. I feel like I'm home. I love that little glow on the horizon.



BEST IN ABSTRACT **Jeanine Nagrod** "Chaos in Bloom" (watercolor/collage)

The transparency of colors with the torn edges separated makes this tiny work successful.

"Follow The Leader" (Mixed Media)

I wasn't sure how this was created and I had to really study the fish. The soft detailed washed out background really captured my eye against contrasting fish.

I enjoyed a lot about this painting. The color fields first caught my eye, then the composition. I want to run through the painting. The use of alternating contrasts, and the foreground of tree placements is well done.

BEST IN FIGURATIVE **Lou Riccio** "Bruno,-Life Study" (oils)



Immediately I can tell the mastery of the medium with the playfulness of the brush. I love the control of painterly beard and look closely how the glasses are painted - mastered it.

Jim Inzero - Biography

Jim Inzero (b.1972, New Haven, Connecticut) Earned his BFA with a concentration in Interior Architecture from Maryland Institute College of Art. Inzero's passion for painting awakened when he traveled to San Miquel De Allende, Mexico in 2004. Jim decided to pursue his love of art full time in 2006. In 2007 Jim opened the Jim Inzero Gallery in Pt. Pleasant Beach and then in 2018 opened another gallery next door on the street level. Jim currently judges for the Annual Congressional Art Competition for Congressman Christopher H. Smith.

Jim lives on the Metedeconk River in New Jersey. He uses an ancient technique known as Encaustic 'Hot Wax' to construct his paintings. Inzero reflects his life long attraction to the shore and its surroundings in every bit of his work. Since childhood, Inzero has been drawn to nature, it has always inspired him to express the peace and rest

that he experiences. The light in the sky, the clouds, the sea, the movement of water and the horizon are a great inspiration to his work. Inzero's paintings are built up layer by layer then using a blow torch to fuse each layer for greater luminosity. It is difficult for me to envision my work as separate from myself. It is an extension of who I am-a way to express the fascination I feel with line, color, and the human form. The process enlivens me, the results are calming and mystifying. Being able to share this with others is a gift I often find rewarding. How does one explain why any artist feels compelled to create? It's just what I do to feel complete.
