
This month there is a new feature in our newsletter titled "Member Spotlight"

Art Musings

It's All About the Frame

Did you ever go to an art exhibit and as you view the kaleidoscope of colors, styles, sizes and mediums of the art on display, one painting seems to stand out like a sore thumb? Why? The issue is with the frame, which does not seem to sync with the painting. Envision this......a stunning abstract painting in acrylic with a profusion of lines and bright colors surrounded not by a sleek metal frame or a simple black frame but a frame made from barnwood. Not a good choice! In the process of displaying my elementary students' work for hallway bulletin boards or yearly art exhibits, choosing the just right color of construction paper on which to mount the work really made a difference in the presentation and enhanced the child's artwork.

A number of years ago I read an article in Art News Magazine, that a major museum (cannot remember which one) was embarking on a monumental task of changing the frames surrounding many famous paintings. There were "before" and "after" photos which I shared with my fifth grade classes to explain aesthetics which was part of the core curriculum standards. This led to a lively discussion and the students really understood the impact that the right frame could make on the essence of an artwork. As a professional artist, choosing the right frame could also make a difference between a sale or not! A frame can either add to or detract from a painting, so choose carefully. BJC

A Gelli Plate is made from a unique plastic mixed with mineral oil to give it a "cushy" surface. Artists use this printing surface as a base to create original hand-printed papers to be used in collages and mixed media. Tamara will demonstrate how to use a variety of objects as well as stamps and stencils to create beautiful monoprints.











October Member Meeting


