Emotion and Art

"A work of art is a world in itself, reflecting senses and emotions of the artist's world"

Hans Hoffman

Art is an expression and response to our emotions. Artmaking represents the innermost feelings of a person that is reflected in their art. As artists, we are aware of this but what about when you look at a painting or a sculpture. Did you ever experience an emotional reaction? Did you feel happy? Energized? Sad? Angry? Maybe you had no feelings at all. I once read a book which focused on Mark Rothko's Chapel in Houston, Texas. Fourteen massive paintings in varying hues of black, fill the space between the floor and ceiling. The book describes the emotional reactions of the chapel's visitors. Benches invite contemplation but not always tranquility. Most reactions were feelings of despair, sadness and many tears. It was a depressing read but I continued, hoping for a happier ending....that didn't happen! As I read, I thought of my own reaction to an exhibit at the Philadelphia Museum of Art in 2000 "Van Gogh: Face to Face". As I walked into one room, I was surrounded by the portraits of Joseph Roulin and his family. Joseph was the Postman in Arles. As I looked from face to face in the portraits of Joseph, his wife Augustine and their children, a wave of sadness overtook me, and I began to cry. Joseph was Van Gogh's loyal friend, the one who found Van Gogh after he cut off his ear and ran for the doctor. How did they feel as he painted them? What did they talk about? What was their reaction to his death? I thought of the passion Van Gogh had for his paintings but received little or no recognition. What feelings did he experience as he painted the Roulin family? What was he trying to express? That museum visit, 22 years ago, has remained a vivid emotional experience to this day, one that has never been repeated. BJC

A Gelli Plate is made from a unique plastic mixed with mineral oil to give it a "cushy" surface. Artists use this printing surface as a base to create original hand-printed papers to be used in collages and mixed media. Tamara will demonstrate how to use a variety of objects as well as stamps and stencils to create beautiful monoprints.
