Art Musings

Originality

We get ideas for our paintings from many sources, including images we photograph, our imagination, and even the classes and workshops we take. Are we inspired by something we see? Is it another artists' work? It's crucial to keep learning from other artists. Taking a class or workshop is a way of growing artistically, exploring and challenging your limits. If you want your art to be meaningful, master the basics and in early stages, it may mean copying the works of others. There is nothing wrong with mimicking others' work. Picasso did it and many of the great artists learned that way but this all leads you to develop your own original style.

When we exhibit the resulting paintings, are we mindful of the source of that painting? At no point should you exhibit a work that was done in class and call it your own. The instructor should make it clear to their students that the work they are copying is the property of the instructor and cannot be entered into a show without crediting the source. As artists, continue to be inspired by others but make your art your own. *BJC*

Arlene Newman will be doing a demonstration for the Laurelton Art Society, on Saturday September 16, 2-4pm; at the First Baptist Church of Laurelton's Ivy Hall, 1832 route 88 (Post Road), Brick, 08723 She will be using Heritage Multimedia paints and showing how the paints can blend like oils without being toxic like oil paints. These paints stay open, (stay wet), longer than traditional acrylic paint which allows for more blendability. Arlene will show us how to use Alla Prima techniques for this demo.

Eligible Work: Open only to members of MRGA and ASMC. Original work only. No reproductions. No photography, sculpture, or digital art. Art must be properly framed, wired and ready to hang. No sawtooth hangers. No works larger than 24"x 36", including frame. No nudes or political statements. MRGA reserves the right to refuse artwork that does not conform to the criteria.

Entry Rules: All artwork must be for sale and remain on display for the duration of the exhibit. An artist will be notified of a potential buyer. It is the artist's responsibility to manage the sale and to forward a 20% commission to the Middletown Arts Center. Sales Tax remittance is the responsibility of the artist.

By entering the show, artists agree that their name, likeness and image of their work may be used for publicity purposes. Artists are encouraged to insure their works, as the MRGA and MAC are not responsible for damage or loss of artwork during the Exhibit.

Cash Awards Sponsored by OceanFirst Bank: Awards will be determined by an independent judge and presented at the Reception. Award winners will be asked to provide a jpeg of their work to be posted on the MRGA website. No artist may receive more than one award.

Submission Fee: There is a non-refundable \$15 entry fee which must be paid by a check made out to "MRGA". The entry fee along with a completed entry form, must be received by MRGA by Sept. 19th.
